# Fully vaccinated travellers returning or travelling to Canada

If you're planning to travel to Canada, it's important to be aware of the mandatory requirements that protect both you and people in Canada from the spread of COVID-19.

Fully vaccinated citizens of all countries are allowed to enter Canada for non-essential travel or tourism if they meet specific criteria and fulfill all requirements. To be considered fully vaccinated, travellers must have received a full series of a <u>COVID-19 vaccine accepted by Government of Canada</u> (or a combination of accepted vaccines). Travellers must receive their last dose at least 14 days prior to the day they enter Canada.

It is mandatory for travellers to use <u>ArriveCAN</u> (available as a free mobile app or online) to submit mandatory information digitally before boarding a flight or crossing by land or water into Canada.

### Check the requirements for entering Canada.

## Take a COVID-19 molecular test within 72 hours before your scheduled flight.

All travellers 5 years of age or older, regardless of citizenship, must provide proof of a negative <u>COVID-19 molecular test</u> or evidence of a positive COVID-19 molecular test taken 14 to 180 days prior to arrival in Canada. Rapid antigen tests will not be accepted.

### STEP 3

#### Enter your information in ArriveCAN before you board your flight or leave for a land border crossing.

Download the latest version of the free ArriveCAN mobile app or sign in online at <u>Canada.ca/ArriveCAN</u>. You must submit your travel and contact information, your quarantine plan (in case you are required to quarantine), a COVID-19 symptom self-assessment and your proof of vaccination in ArriveCAN within 72 hours before your arrival and before you board your flight to Canada. Once complete, you will receive an ArriveCAN receipt. If you are a foreign national travelling for discretionary purposes, you will only get an ArriveCAN receipt if all travellers are fully vaccinated; you must show your receipt to be allowed to board the flight to Canada.



STEP 4

Upon arrival in Canada, you'll need to provide your proof of vaccination (in paper or digital format). You will have to complete an arrival test if selected for random mandatory testing. Be prepared to answer questions about eligibility, vaccination and health screening.



If you are required to take an arrival test, you may be asked to take a test on-site, or you may be given a self-swab kit to complete (which will need to be virtually observed) and send it to the lab.

If your <u>on-arrival test</u> is positive, you must follow the instructions of your local public health authority. Keep your proof of vaccination and test results for 14 days.



ArriveCAN is free and can be easily downloaded as a mobile app, or you can sign in online. ArriveCAN does not use any technology or data to monitor or track traveller movements, so your privacy is always protected. Some fully vaccinated travellers who are currently able to enter Canada may be exempt from the 14-day quarantine requirement. Find out more at <u>travel.gc.ca/travel-covid</u>. If you violate any instructions provided to you when you enter Canada or break your mandatory quarantine or isolation requirements, you will be faced with fines, penalties or imprisonment.
